## Upcoming 2024 Marching Band Season

The Farmington High School Marching Band is one of three teams from Farmington High School that have claimed state championships since the school opened five years ago. The marching band claimed back-to-back 5A state championships in 2019 and 2020. Last year, the marching band placed $3^{\text {rd }}$ overall state-wide and in all of 6A! This year's competition show theme will be revealed at the information step-off meeting on Wednesday, May $8^{\text {th }}$. It features music by Ludwig Goransson, Phil Collins, and Alan Menken. It's going to be something our state has never seen and heard! We have new percussion and sound design arrangers this year. They truly are the best of the best. This same team helped crown Avon HS grand national champions this past season.

Every year we hope to be bigger, stronger, and better than ever, working hard at every rehearsal, every show, always striving for our very best. 2024 is sure to be an amazing season, but to do this we need you! Incoming ninth graders and sophomores are especially needed more than ever in the 6A Open class division. Last year we were still one of the smallest bands in our competitive class. We need this to change if we are going to perform well and be competitive in our class. Our goal is to always strive for the school's first ever 6A state championship. Most importantly, however, is to provide a superior product and experience that the students will remember for a lifetime.

We understand that participating in marching band is a significant time and financial commitment. However, the benefits gained greatly outweigh any sacrifices. ## How to Register and Pay Your Registration Fee

1. Carefully read the entire contract, and then fill out and sign the marching band registration/contract signature form at the following link by Friday, April, 19, 2024:
2. Pay your deposit on myDSD to complete your registration starting on Friday, April $26^{\text {th }}$. The deposit is $\$ 250$, and is due no later than Friday, May 10, 2024. Unpaid contracts will be considered incomplete and we will proceed with the show design without you.

- Continue to pay all other fees (including clothing orders, trip fees, and instrument rentals) as they are invoiced through your myDSD account. You will be able to choose to pay fees in the main office, or through your myDSD account online. Please do not try to pay fees before being invoiced. This system ensures that marching band fees go to the correct account and will help us keep accurate records.

Communication: After you complete your contract/registration, you will start receiving communications from the band. Please read these messages completely so you can stay informed.

CutTime (formerly Charms): Every band student will be given a CutTime account after registration is completed. Please make sure your information is up to date. We use these services to manage our band calendar, communications, inventory, and more. Instructions after the merger will be sent out with instructions on how to login, update, and access your information that the band uses to communicate.

Volunteering: Our band program simply can't function without parent volunteers, so parents, please plan on volunteering in some capacity. ## Fee Breakdown and Payment Schedule

Marching band is funded completely through student fees. Our school district does not allocate any resources for new equipment, staff, music, drill, transportation, etc. Below is a breakdown of the fees associated with participation. Your signed contract and deposit are a binding agreement wherein you acknowledge and accept the designated fees listed and agree to be invoiced and pay by the indicated deadlines. The fees below indicate the expected amount that each student will be charged. Basic marching band fees pay for camps/clinics, custom-arranged music, choreography, drill design, flags, equipment, camp food, staff, and uniforms.

## Fee Breakdown/Payment Schedule

Gray boxes are for all students, white boxes are variable amounts depending on needs of the student. The basic fee that every student will pay minimally is $\$ 900$.

## Farmington High School 2024 Marching Band Contract

The Farmington High School Marching Band members take great pride knowing they belong to a group of talented, dedicated students, all working as a team toward the same goal: musical excellence and having a lot of FUN. Attendance, attitude, and hard work are all paramount to the success of the group. This contract has been developed to explain the rules and requirements for participation in the Farmington High School Marching Band. This contract should be read, discussed, and signed by both the student and their parents.

As a member of the Farmington High School Marching Band, I agree to abide by the following policies and procedures. I further understand that any violation of any one of these policies could result in my spot being forfeited and/or being removed from the group entirely.

## 1. Attendance Policy

- When a student misses a rehearsal or performance, it places an unnecessary hardship on the entire ensemble. For this reason, it is vital that parents and students work out schedules, as well as any academic/behavioral consequences, that do NOT include missing rehearsals or performances. The attendance policy will be strictly enforced, so please check your calendars carefully and do not commit to the season if you are not able to participate fully according to this attendance policy. Find specific dates on our band calendar www.farmingtonbands.org. Any additional performances or practices not on the current calendar will be part of this contract if at least two weeks' notice is given.
- Rehearsals/Sectionals: Practices and sectionals are essential in order for a performance group of this caliber to continue to be competitive.
- Parades \& Football Games: Members are expected to be at parades and games as they are actual performances. Follow the attendance policy for absences if you need to miss.
- Competitions: All competitions are required. No exceptions will be given except for rare, extenuating circumstances. If a competition is missed and prior approval is not received, you will likely forfeit your spot permanently to an alternate or be removed at Mr. Mangelson's discretion.
- Camps/Clinics: Camps and clinics are absolutely vital if you would like to receive a drill spot.


## 2. Absences

School credit is given for participation in marching band, so attendance is required. Participation, preparation, and attendance will not only affect the student's final grade but will also have a dramatic impact on the success of the group as we rehearse and prepare for our performances and competitions.

- Reasons to miss band: Sickness and emergencies
- Not reasons to miss band:

Doctor appointments, getting help at school, music lessons, parties, dates, work or driver's ed (please schedule these at other times). Students should inform their employers of the band schedule and make certain they do not miss any part of any rehearsal or performances.

- Summer Band Absences:
$>$ ALL STUDENTS MUST ATTEND REQUIRED SUMMER CAMPS
$>$ Absences during the summer band season can be accommodated for church camps, family vacations, etc. unless they occur during a required camp.
> Please keep absences to a minimum and make sure allowed absences are excused.
- Fall Band Absences (after school starts):
$>$ ALL STUDENTS MUST ATTEND REQUIRED CLEANING CAMPS \& COMPETITIONS
$>$ No absence at the rehearsal prior to a performance/competition will be excused unless there are extenuating circumstances- these must be preapproved. A student missing this rehearsal will likely result in the student not marching at the competition or game that follows, as well as possibly forfeiting their spot permanently.
$>$ For all other band events, students will be allowed a maximum of zero (0) unexcused absences, and three (3) excused absences during the fall season.
- How to have an absence excused: This is for all band events during the entire season
$>$ Please fill out and turn in an excuse form to a drum major. (Form is on the band website)
$>$ A minimum of two (2) weeks' notice is required.
> Turning in a form does not guarantee approval. Your excuse form will be returned to you and/or you will be contacted by Mr. Mangelson or a drum major only if the absence request is denied.


## 3. Alternates

Some students in the band may begin the season as "alternates." An alternate is a band member who is not assigned a permanent drill spot, but who is qualified to participate and may be called on to fill an unexpected void. Just as an athletic team selects more players than can be on the field or court at a given time, in marching band we need to do the same. Alternates are NOT second-class band members who do not perform. On the contrary, alternates are crucial to the success of the band. They are so important that many award-winning programs across the country have as many as 20-30 alternates. This will not be the case at Farmington, but we may have at least one alternate in each section. Alternates assist the various sections during the daily rehearsals to double check spots and charts, assist leaders with visual identification, and to help with equipment and props. Alternates will be called on to fill in spots for students who quit, are ill, injured, on vacation, etc. Sometimes alternates are needed simply because the drill design works best with certain even numbers in each section due to symmetry and other geometric factors needed for the show. Historically, alternates eventually get incorporated into the show by the end of the season and often more would have been helpful.

## 4. Core Band Class Participation

Participation in the marching band at Farmington High School is completely optional. However, all marching band students are required to participate in a "core" band class concurrently for the entire school year. Concert Band, Symphonic Band, and Wind Ensemble along with their respective percussion classes are considered "core" band classes. Violations to this policy will forfeit eligibility to march the following year if they are still enrolled as a student.

## 5. Music Memorization

All music must be memorized by the designated deadlines. Music must be passed off to their section leaders and/or a staff member. Section leaders and field commanders are there to help you, so please utilize their help. Every student is expected to arrive at camps with his or her music memorized.
6. Drill

Members may be asked at various times throughout the season to perform their drill segments and marching technique for their section leaders, staff, and/or Mr. Mangelson. Drill segments will include proper field position, horn position, body and dance movements, etc. Failure to demonstrate the minimum competence necessary as indicated by Mr. Mangelson could result in losing a drill spot. Students will be asked to fill out a $3 \times 5$ sized "dot book" or binder, which they are required to have with
them at every rehearsal. While learning the show, students will complete this "dot book" by writing in information about each set of the show.

## 7. Eligibility

- All students must meet UHSAA eligibility requirements in order to participate.
- Each student will need to get a physical and turn in the appropriate medical forms. These forms can be printed out from the band website. (Go to www.farmingtonbands.org. Select Performance Groups, then select Marching Band, and then select the red UHSAA Physical button)
- Students must maintain a 2.0 GPA. An eligibility check will be performed on all students in June before marching band season starts. Grades will be checked again at the end of first term to determine if students are still eligible to participate in state finals, BOA regionals, and any other trips that might take place after the first term.


## 8. Fees

- The fees for marching band and any associated trips have been provided and disclosed on the fee breakdown. All fees must be paid by the designated dates and are non-refundable regardless of removal from the group (voluntarily or involuntarily). By "opting in" to be a part of the marching band, I agree to the fees as they have been explained. I also understand that marching band is not a required activity and that by "opting in", the marching band and travel fees are not waivable, and I am responsible for paying these fees in their entirety.
- Fee/Fundraising Money Explanation
$>$ Marching Band Fees: Basic marching band fees pay for camps/clinics, custom-arranged music, choreography, drill design, flags, equipment, band camp food, staff, and fall uniforms.
$>$ Instrument Rental Fee: This money is used to repair and maintain school owned instruments. $>$ Uniforms/Shoes Fee: This money is used to purchase uniforms and shoes for the students.
$\rightarrow$ Trip Fees: This money is only used towards a trip. It will cover hotel costs, buses, competition fees, food, and any included activities.
- Fundraising Money: This money is used to pay for all meals and snacks beyond those served at band camp. We also use this money to purchase new equipment, and maintain our trailer.


## 9. Optional Individual Fundraisers

- The band will provide at least one individual fundraiser per year. This will help students offset their individual fees and trip costs.
- These fundraisers are completely optional.
- Information will be shared for this fundraiser on our band website and through email.


## 10. Band Fundraisers

- These fundraisers benefit the entire program and participation is strongly encouraged and expected.
- The goal is for each student to bring in at least $\$ 250$ worth of donations for the band program. This can be accomplished a few different ways:
$>$ The student can secure a sponsorship for the marching band from any business. This is the quickest and easiest way to reach your goal of $\$ 250$.
$>$ The student can participate in the marching band's annual online fundraiser (formerly known as Tag Day). With this fundraiser, students will reach out to friends, neighbors, and family members in order to secure donations.
$>$ The student can choose to participate in both fundraising opportunities.

- Bonus: If a student is able to raise $\$ 1,500$ through Sponsorships and/or the Online Fundraiser, their end of season trip fee will be reduced by $\$ 250$.

11. Appearance

- To ensure uniformity of the band, extremes in appearance such as unnatural hair color, some facial jewelry, hair over the collar, beards, mustaches, "Jedi braids" (or similar), etc. are not permissible at any time during the season. This will be strictly enforced.

12. Behavior

Marching Band is a competitive activity and as such, has the potential to bring out the best or worse in us. It's our goal to become a better band and better individuals as we participate in marching band.
Our staff, students, and parents are committed to the following behaviors.

- We show good sportsmanship and are friendly towards other bands: We'll clap and cheer for other bands at competitions. They've worked just as hard as we have and they deserve our support. We'll be friendly towards ALL bands. We'll say hello, wave, and give words of encouragement to them. Part of being friendly also means that we'll avoiding all negative talk about other bands.
- We are a band family: We believe that every member of our band is important. No individuals or sections are superior to another. Color guard, percussion, woodwinds, and brass are all vital to the success of our band. We don't tolerate negative talk, put downs, or acting like one group is better than another. Instead, we look for ways to support all sections and individuals within our band family.
- We are not complainers: Complaining never fixes anything. If we have constructive criticism then we go to the appropriate person to address our concern. We'll always be respectful and considerate when addressing concerns. If there's no fix for a complaint then we'll keep it to ourselves.
- We are respectful, grateful, and helpful: We treat everyone with respect. Kind words and actions are always the best choice. When we have the chance to thank someone for their efforts, we do it. We look for ways to be helpful to others. We hold doors open, help with set-up and clean-up, and find ways to go the extra mile.

By signing this contract, we understand and agree to the above stated policies. We realize that the success of the Farmington High School Marching Band is dependent upon our dedication and commitment to these policies. We agree to have the named student removed from the marching band if these expectations are not adhered to. We also understand that this contract constitutes a binding agreement and that the deposit and fees associated with this contract are non-refundable. We agree to be charged the stated fees in their entirety unless written notice is given to Mr. Mangelson that we would like to have the named student removed from the marching band before May 13, 2024. We also acknowledge that all fees are nonrefundable regardless of the student's removal from the group either voluntarily or involuntarily after this deadline.
